- tapping ocular chambers

With Dr A. Dwyer:

- patient restraint and ocular imaging with a digital camera
- placement of SPL catheters and tips for its management in the field
- nasolacrimal duct flushing, subconjunctival injection
- ocular cytology (technique and interpretation)
